Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I pray you all had a wonderful and restful Thanksgiving and are easing into the Advent season, which you may have noticed is later than usual in the Christian calendar. In most years, the first week of Advent is the last Sunday in November. This year Advent begins this Sunday Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> and 'Advent 4' is not only Christmas Eve, but Christmas eve is also a Sunday.

You may have also noticed that the Stewardship drive is later than usual. That was intentional.

Given the fact that this congregation has had so much change in the last number of years, sending out a 1-dimensional pledge form letter didn't seem to reflect the energy, enthusiasm and hard work that is happening in this faith community.

If you've been able to be present in worship or attend on-line, you've seen the joy, gratitude and depth that is being shared among members, friends and visitors alike. While I've only been with you a short time, I believe there are many ways in which to honor, celebrate as well as plan for your future together.

Admittedly, I'm a bit of a stewardship nerd, but I think that there are lots of creative and meaningful ways to discern how to dedicate time, treasure and talent beyond filling out a pledge card and dropping it in the plate or the mail.

To that end, this year, we will be recognizing and dedicating stewardship through a theme of giving gifts of **frankincense**, **gold and myrrh** on Dec 17<sup>th</sup>. As you all know, these are the gifts thought to be brought by the magi in response to the birth of the Christ-child.

To be clear, we are NOT expecting you bring bars of gold, myrrh oil and incense to worship that day (I'll take care of that!) but we will be inviting you to fill out 3 separate cards as part of your offerings for 2024, one of which will be your 2024 **pledge commitment** (i.e. gold). The other 2, will be commitments for how YOU can bring good news and to this faith community with your **ideas and participation** (frankincense), and how you can help bring **hope and healing** to this church and the community through volunteering/supporting current and future missions (myrrh).

On Dec 17<sup>th</sup> we will have a special service and dedication for all three of your offerings. If you are unable to attend worship, you can mail or email your (confidential) choices to me, Dawn Clarke, or Steve Kitsko. We will also send you a mailing so you can fill out your cards ahead of time.

I hope this will inspire you to not only look at stewardship differently but also Advent as whole. If three outsiders got the message that the world was about to change...stopped what they were doing and journeyed to Bethlehem with their best with deep for hope for a new dawn, maybe you can too.

#### What Are We Waiting For?

Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him.

Luke 2:25 NIV

Drive to the Dr's office. Sit. Wait. Go to the bank. Get in line. Wait. Pick up your mail. That letter you've been expecting is not there. Wait. The test results are not in yet. Wait. That phone call from your child you've been hoping for hasn't come yet. Wait. Wait. Wait.

A disproportionate part of our lives is spent waiting for the next thing, waiting for some good news, waiting for something to happen, something to change, something to finally start, or something to finally end.

We are not alone in the waiting. We are in good company. From the Gospel of Luke, we read the story of Simeon, an old man who had been waiting for the consolation of Israel, for something to change, for something to end and something new to begin. Well, Simeon finds that his waiting might be coming to an end when presented with a child. A child. A defenseless, harmless, innocent child, not even able to walk or talk. What kind of consolation would that child bring to Israel? What kind of change would a little baby bring about that would fulfill Simeon's dreams? Simeon would have to wait to find out, but now he waits with a new hope in his heart, full of the Holy Spirit.

Is everything that Christ promises to bring about readily available to us right here, right now? Yes, and not yet. As we travel the Advent journey, we find ourselves in a liminal space. In the space between the "already and the not yet." In the space where we are called to <u>wait</u> for the completion of what Christ has already done through birth, his ministry, his healing, his words, his sacrificial life.

As we enter the season of Advent, we are presented with the same questions. "What are we waiting for?" And yet, that very question can be turned into a statement, "Christ is what we are waiting for"; Christ, bringing about reconciliation between God and God's creation; Christ, inaugurating a time of hope, of peace, of joy and of love; Christ, modeling for us a better way to live with each other, a better way of regarding each other, a better way of caring for each other, of loving one another.

Let us pray: "God of expectations, maybe we be enabled to wait patiently like Simeon, through the help and sustenance of the Holy Spirit, until your realm is brought to fulness and completion. Through Christ we pray. Amen."
