

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I write this, it is a an unusually warm and sunny day and honestly... the minute I get home from the church office, I plan to put my flip flops on. Then I will likely dismantle the last vestiges of my window box flowers and harvest the very last, albeit scrawny, basil pots and prep for the colder weather and turning the clocks back.

For many of us, this is a difficult time of year for a variety of reasons including shorter days and colder nights, bare trees, more frequent gray days and both anticipation and anxiety of the holiday season.

But invariably, these next few months always deliver surprises, unexpected joys, and new insights. I often struggle to trust that, but the writer of Hebrews reminds us: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." That is my hope for all of us.

To that end, Pastor Roberto and I will be leading a month-long bible study exploring "Walking by Faith" in chapters 11 and 12 in the book of Hebrews. There's no homework and we will also be preaching through those texts weekly as fodder for our time together. I hope you will consider participating in this endeavor, each week immediately after worship where we will have fellowship and food for the body and soul.

We will also be honoring those we've lost in the last year, at a special All Soul's service on Nov 5th, which will also include communion. If you're unable to attend, you can worship remotely or find our recorded service on our website.

There are a few more opportunities coming your way to actively **walk by faith**, but you'll have to wait for those special announcements and <u>just have faith</u> that although the light may be dimming God is guiding us into new life, blessings, and hope of things yet unseen!

A Message from Pastor Roberto

You're a Gift!

There is a variety of gifts, but always the same Spirit. There is a variety of ministries, but we serve the same One. There is a variety of outcomes, but the same God is working in all of them. To each person is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

1 Corinthians 12:4-7

If you were attending church in person this past Sunday, Oct 22nd, you might have participated in a little exercise we did after the sermon. We asked everyone to write down on a post-it note, their gifts in three categories:

- Gifts of the hand making, building, putting together. Skills like baking, crafts, sowing, or construction, playing an instrument, or anything else that involves some physical skill.
- Gifts of the heart empathy, listening skills, compassion, prayers, etc.
- Gifts of the head teaching, accounting of financial knowledge, languages, organizing things, etc. connecting people of different cultures.

At the end of the service, we placed all the post-it notes on a board (take a look at the pictures) and we were **amazed** at the abundance of gifts we have in our midst.

We have people who can cook, sow and sing. We have multilingual people, accountants and people gifted in providing counselling, offering a compassionate word and listen. We have gifts of friendship, encouragement, fixers, leaders and even the gift of humor.

Rather than operating out of a mentality of scarcity, perhaps focusing on our problems, on what we do not have, on the ABSENCE of gifts, this little exercise reminded us that we have a congregation that is tremendously gifted and ready to put those gifts to work for the common good. I think that these are the key words in the passage above: common good.

So, here's an invitation for each and every one of us. Contemplate how fortunate we are to have a gifted congregation and embrace the opportunity to put your gifts to good use. Go ahead and bake a cake for our fellowship hour. Go ahead and join the work of the deacons and put your gift of compassion and your listening skills to good use. Go ahead and join the liturgists and help the church worship in spirit and in truth. Go ahead and volunteer for the After School Home program and put your gift of teaching and patience and organization to work for the common good. You are a gift to this community and your presence makes us better.

Prayer: Gracious God. Thank you for the gifts you have given us. Help us make good use of them. Amen.




