



A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A few weeks ago, I was getting gas at my local QuickChek when I hear this racket. I turned off the radio to see where the noise was coming from. A car, at my '12 o'clock' was pulling into the parking lot. A substantial car part had dropped from its rightful place underneath the car and was now dragging and scraping the macadam. He pulled into the very first parking spot so he could get out and find the culprit. It looked to me like the engine under cover had fallen down, and so did his face. He started making phone calls. I was hoping he had AAA.

A few hours later, I was driving on the highway to my book group and saw another car, this time a small pickup truck which <u>also</u> had a part dangling from the back of his undercarriage, although thankfully it wasn't scraping the ground. Weird!

Three hours later, upon leaving my book group, I saw and heard car in front of me, which was pulling a small trailer and the connecting chains were dragging and scraping the pavement making sparks all the way down the road. Three times in one day? What was the message?

I chewed on it for a couple of days and thought well, when we don't pay attention to car maintenance, things go wrong. It's the same for our prayer life. When we are not consistently attuned to God and what God wants for our lives, we can miss all sorts of clues and lessons that God wants to show us and share with us. We can even find ourselves adrift or sidelined with no clear direction because we've let our prayer life somewhere in the rearview mirror.

As we've been talking about throughout August in worship, the first step to getting our prayer life back on track is paying attention, especially to signs that may be hints or invitations from God. The second step to growing our prayer life is by doing 'regular maintenance' by turning to scripture. The Psalms are particularly helpful for this. The third step is learning to "listen" to and for God. Just like we do when we bring our car in for maintenance or repair. The mechanic's first question always is: "What does the problem SOUND like?" It's the same when we listen for God's voice. The last step in strengthening our prayer life is to learn to STOP and BE Still. Psalm 46 says "Be Still and know that I am God".

Knowing that God is WITH us and wants to keep us up and running is both comforting but also very helpful. When difficulties come, we are then prepared and able to handle whatever comes because prayer will give us peace, insight and patience in life's unexpected and crazy moments. May you seek to continue to deepen your prayer life we move into Fall and begin to explore our monthly theme of Discipleship.

Peace Be with You!

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. (John 14:27 NRSVUE)

Every Sunday we share the Peace of Christ. Besides the joy of embracing and welcoming each other, we share something special. The Peace of Christ is not just the absence of conflict, but a guiding principle to organize our lives as a community and our view of the world. This month of September we have a unique opportunity, not only to wish peace to each other, but to actively participate in the work of peace.

Every year for the past 40 years, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) sponsors the Peacemaking Program, helping congregations engage in active peacemaking in their own communities while also participating in peacemaking around the world. We will be collecting a special offering every week until World Communion Sunday – which is October 1st. Twenty five percent of the special offering will be used to support a local peace initiative of our choosing, 25% will go to a regional fund and 50% will go to sustain the work of peace around the world. Initiatives include addressing social unrest, political violence and persecution, issues of refugee resettlement and gun violence and bullying among others. When giving to these causes please be generous. Since 1984 more than 350 International Peacemakers from 60 countries have been hosted through the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Peacemaking Program from partner denominations and organizations around the world. They visit Presbyteries each year to interpret issues of peace and justice. These visits inform, open hearts and minds, touch lives, establish relationships, inspire new ministries, help us understand peace and justice concerns around the world, and provide insights that can inspire us to greater

One of the ten 2023 Peacemakers will spend almost a week in our Presbytery September 15 through September 21. She is Magdalena Łuczak, a humanitarian activist working in Poland. Professionally associated with the Helsinki Foundation for Human Rights, she works with a focus on the rights of minorities at the Polish-Belarusian border. Magdalena's humanitarian activism history includes working on a rescue team in the Greek Island of Lesbos and in refugee centers in Berlin, Germany.

Her schedule will include a presentation at Presbytery, on the morning of September 17th at First Presbyterian Church Tenafly; **engaging in a time of sharing and conversation FOR ALL that afternoon 4:00 pm at our church in Springfield**; presenting through a zoom FOR ALL on Tuesday night, September 19 and visits to various mission and ministry sites. We hope that you will decide to participate, both with your financial contribution and with your presence on September 17th at 4:00 pm.

Peace is only possible when we commit to working for it, defending it and contributing to spreading it far and wide. When we do that, the **peace** of God, which surpasses all **understanding**, will guard our hearts and our minds in Christ Jesus.
